# Dr. Gérald Rheault to receive CSPS Lifetime Achievement Award

Dr. GÉRALD RHEAULT of Montréal will receive the Canadian Society of Plastic Surgeons Lifetime Achievement Award on the evening of June 23<sup>rd</sup> at the 72<sup>nd</sup> Annual Meeting of the CSPS.

Since his certification as a Plastic Surgeon in 1967, Dr. Rheault has contributed to the Canadian Plastic Surgery community. He served as vice-president of the CSPS in 1986-87 and then as president in 1987-88. He was president of the Canadian Society of Aesthetic Plastic Surgery in 1990 in addition to serving as president of the Medical Expert Society of Quebec. In 1983, as Treasurer and organizing

committee member of the meeting of the International Confederation of Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgery (IPRAS), Dr. Rheault contributed to the success of that conference, leading to the establishment of the Educational Foundation of the CSPS.

In 1987 Gérald Rheault proposed several progressive changes: central office computer, secretary, printed abstracts for the annual scientific program, bilingual patient information pamphlets and a regular Educational Symposium at the Annual Meeting.

As noted by Dr. Dale Birdsell in his nominating letter, "Gérald

### Dr. John Semple at TW FW18



Inner strength, hope and courage were the theme of David Dixon's collection presented at Toronto Women's Fashion Week (TW FW) 18 in March. The collection, designed exclusively for Women's College Hospital (WCH), is an interpretation of an original watercolour painting by CSPS member and past president, Dr. John Semple. Dr. Semple is also an acclaimed artist and an alumni of the Ontario College of Art and Design. The collection was inspired by Dixon's own personal experience of watching a loved one face cancer.

Dr. Semple noted that it would have been easy for a designer to create a collection prior to the painting's completion and then retrofit the two together. However, David waited until the artwork was completed before starting the pieces for the collection. As Dixon shares, "once I saw the painting, I knew what to do". The collection and the painting go hand-in-hand.

Although it may seem a simple, logical step now, when Gérald 'computerized' the Society in the late 1980's, it was a monumental step forward. As I recall it was like 'herding cats' or pushing a 'wet noodle'. During this same era, Gérald made another decision and convinced the leadership that it was time for the Society to establish a 'central office' and hire a secretary."

With his many innovations and devotion to the Society, Dr. Rheault has made an indelible impression on the CSPS. He retired from practice in 2005 but the Canadian Society of Plastic Surgeons continues to benefit from his past efforts.
