

Locum: September 1, 2018 – December 31, 2018
Plastic Surgeon - South Health Campus

The Department of Surgery, Section of Plastic Surgery, and Alberta Health Services invite applications for a clinical faculty position as a PLASTIC SURGEON at the South Health Campus in Calgary, Alberta, joining an existing group of four surgeons. This locum will cover the practice of a surgeon on academic leave from September 1, 2018 – December 31, 2018. The SHC has a busy hand practice and has expanded its breast reconstruction program, to include both autologous and alloplastic reconstruction.

The Department of Surgery requires the applicant to have at least one year of post-residency fellowship training, and be competent in hand surgery, microsurgery, and reconstructive breast surgery. The surgeon will be expected to participate actively in undergraduate and resident education.

The successful candidate will have an on-site office and be provided with operative and ambulatory clinic privileges at the South Health Campus. The surgeon will be expected to participate in the plastic surgery and hand surgery call schedules at the South Health Campus. The successful applicant will be expected to fulfill the clinical obligations of the surgeon on leave including performing surgery on currently booked and new plastic surgery patients, follow-up of existing patients and consultation on new patients, overseeing residents and medical students and taking part in the Section on-call schedule.

The successful candidate must be eligible for licensure by the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Alberta and must hold Fellowship certification in Plastic Surgery from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.

Calgary Highlights:

Calgary is approximately 80km east of the Canadian Rockies and is located in the transition zone between the Rocky Mountain Foothills and the Canadian Prairies. It is the largest city in Alberta, with a metropolitan population of 1,239,220 people (Statistics Canada, 2016). The city is large in physical area, consisting of an inner city surrounded by suburban communities of various densities.
