The Division of Plastic Surgery at the Ottawa Hospital, in affiliation with the University of Ottawa, invites applications for a permanent full-time plastic surgeon with fellowship training in hand and wrist surgery.

The Ottawa Hospital is the regional trauma center for a catchment area of 1.2 million in Eastern Ontario and offers a full spectrum of tertiary and quaternary services. Our Division currently includes 12 full time members and operates with a focus on growth and collegiality. Resources include access to clinic space with well-appointed minor surgery facilities, a full hand therapy program, and main operating room time. Remuneration is fee for service. In addition, there is an AFP and a divisional practice plan. Academic appointment through the University of Ottawa is anticipated.

The ideal applicant has completed at least a one-year Orthopedic or Plastic hand fellowship, including both hand- and wrist-specific training, and is committed to providing comprehensive care of the upper extremity. A strong interest in surgical education at both the graduate and undergraduate level is expected. Graduate level training in a relevant area of research or education is preferred.

The candidate must hold certification in Plastic Surgery from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and must be eligible for licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario. The candidate must also possess liability insurance. While all qualified candidates are invited to apply, preference will be given to Canadian citizens and permanent residents.
