

Re: Johnson & Johnson Canada Craniofacial Fellowship Division of Plastic Surgery, University of Ottawa

University of Ottawa is soliciting applications for a fellowship in Craniofacial Surgery. This fellowship will include care of children with complex congenital differences. There is also a focus on adult reconstruction and cranioplasty. There is significant collaboration with neurosurgery and the fellowship will include a substantial volume of intracranial cases. There are opportunities to participate in secondary cleft reconstruction, post-traumatic rhinoplasty and trauma reconstruction.

Fellowships are 6-12 months in duration and based at the University of Ottawa, including The Ottawa Hospital and the Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario.

Applicants must be eligible for independent practice licensure in Ontario. Furthermore, they must be certified by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.

The fellowship will be funded by independent billing as well as financial support from Johnson and Johnson.

Applications are now being received for positions commencing in July 2018.
