

The Department of Surgery, Divisions of Orthopaedic and Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery, at University Health Network is inviting applications for a locum position for a Hand Surgeon.

The effective date of this appointment is immediate.

The locum position will work within the Toronto Western Hand Program and will participate in the clinical care of upper extremity patients. The locum position will take over an established hand and wrist practice for a duration of 6 months with the potential to extend to one year. Dedicated clinic and operating room resources will be provided on a weekly basis. The locum will take an equal share of call within the group of hand surgeons. Microsurgical experience is required as our institution is a regional replantation centre.

The UHN is an academic centre affiliated with the University of Toronto Undergraduate Medical School and Post-graduate resident training programs. The locum position will be involved with resident, fellow and medical student education through clinical activities.

The candidate must be eligible for certification with the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, and licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.
