Dr. Lawrence Hurst to receive CSPS Lifetime Achievement Award

Dr. Lawrence N. Hurst graduated from the University of Toronto in 1965. He did post-graduate training in plastic surgery at the University of Toronto from 1966 to 1971 and was granted his fellowship in surgery in 1971. In 1972, he did a fellowship year at Stanford University Medical Centre in California and is American Board Certified in Plastic Surgery. He joined the University of Western Ontario faculty in 1973 and held the rank of Chairman, Division of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery. His clinical and research interests

were in plastic, hand and micro surgery. He has published widely in these areas. He was Program Director, Residency Training Program of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery from 1992 to 1997 at the University of Western Ontario and he currently holds the rank of Professor Emeritus.

Larry Hurst developed expertise in microsurgery, for which he became noted. Says his colleague, Dr. Brian Evans, "In his professional life he provided mentorship for many of the members of the society, and gave many others a few gray hairs when he served as an examiner for the College. I still see patients in my office who worship him for what he has done for them."

Dr. Hurst has been a CSPS member since 1972. He held the office of President of the CSPS Educational Foundation from 1987 to 1989, Vice-President of the CSPS from 1990-91 and President from 1991-92. He was chair of the Royal

College Plastic Surgery Specialty Committee from 1996-1999.

Dr. Hurst is rumored to have an abiding interest in automobiles, golf, dogs, boating and fishing although CSPS News has it on good authority that the catch is not always a good one so he may rely from time to time on a grocery store to fill the larder with fish.

CSPS News joins his colleagues in congratulating Dr. Hurst on this award.

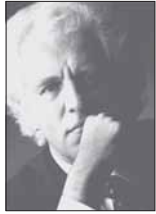

In memoriam

The last year has seen the disappearance of several valued and distinguished members of the Canadian Society of Plastic Surgeons. Society members regret the passing of these Canadian Plastic Surgeons.

Dr. Jacques Papillon was a leader in establishing the Hôtel-Dieu burn unit in Montreal, devoted to state-of-the-art therapeutics, which he directed for over 20 years.



He was acclaimed for his revolutionary treatment of severe burns and his accomplishments in reconstructive surgery of the hand. The catalogue of his publications and presentations on a wide variety of subjects is impressive. In 1991

Jacques Papillon's lifetime of achievements was recognized with the Order of Canada – O.C.

Dr. Papillon became a member of the Canadian Society of Plastic Surgeons in 1969, he was Vice-President in 1990 and President in 1991. From 1979 to 1983 he served as General Secretary of the 8th Congress of the International Confederation of Plastic, Reconstructive and Aesthetic Surgery (IPRAS) held in Montreal.

Dr. Papillon was the proprietor of a highly regarded winery in Quebec's Brome-Missisquoi region: le domaine des Côtes d'Ardoise where he produced a number of wines recognized for their quality.

Dr. Janet Fultz graduated from Queen's University with her medical degree in 1978. She decided to pursue a speciality in plastic and reconstructive surgery, worked in Toronto and Winnipeg, and studied in Scotland, Honolulu, and finally in Paris, where she completed training in February 1985. Her studies abroad may have sparked the love of travel she carried all her life.

In 1985 she established her practice in Moncton and became a member of the CSPA in 1989. She worked at both The Moncton Hospital and the Dr. Georges-L. Dumont University Hospital. She was a well-respected physician with high standards and sincere compassion for her patients and their outcomes. She also had a dry wit and a great sense of humour. But her true love was enjoying the outdoors, and traveling to new places. She hiked and backpacked in places as remote as Nepal and New Zealand. She biked in Alaska and Cuba. She snorkeled in Belize and Palau. She traveled the world and loved every minute - it was a welcome break from a demanding career. But she especially loved hiking the trails of New Brunswick, where Fundy Park was one of her special places. Janet loved nature and animals - she often walked dogs for the SPCA - she loved to walk the big dogs that others were wary of.

Dr. Hugh Thomson joined the Hospital for Sick Children in 1961, became a full Professor in 1982 and remained in active practice until 2000. During his academic career, he gave over 140 presentations and invited lectures and published 102 peer reviewed publications and book chapters in areas of pediatric plastic surgery covering cleft, vascular anomalies and upper extremity surgery.



Dr. Thomson served as President of the Canadian Society of Plastic Surgeons in 1980 and was instrumental in the development of the "Residents' Corner", where plastic surgery Residents are given the opportunity to compete for several "best presentation" prizes. In addition to creating the Society logo, he established the "Beyond the Knife" segment of the CSPA Annual Meeting. A highpoint of the meeting for many, these presentations feature the extracurricular activities of Society members and illustrate Dr. Thomson's feeling that play is as crucial to wellbeing as work. Dr. Thomson was himself an accomplished wood-carver, many of whose works are to be found at the Hospital for Sick Children.

As a teacher and educator, Dr. Thomson touched many in the Plastic Surgery community during his years at the Hospital for Sick Children, making an indelible impression on the numerous trainees who made their way through his service.



Dr. Patrick Shoemaker, became a member of the CSPA in 1974. He was a proud graduate of Ford Trade School (1960), Queen's Medical School (1968) and the University of Toronto Surgical Training Program in Plastic Surgery. He felt it was an honour and privilege to serve the patients of Eastern Ontario as a surgeon and teacher along with supportive and wise colleagues in all disciplines.



Dr. Harvey Brown became a member of the CSPA in 1971 and served as Society president in 1986. He was an Associate Professor, Department of Plastic Surgery,

McGill University. Past president of the Quebec Society of Plastic Surgery and former chair of the McGill Department of Plastic Surgery.

Dr. Brown was a graduate of Queen's University and trained in Montreal and with Professor Skoog at Uppsala University in Sweden. He became a member of the staff of the Montreal Children's and the Montreal General Hospitals, and later also chief of plastic surgery at the Queen Mary Veterans' Hospital prior to its closure. He had an interest in general plastic surgery, but mostly in hand surgery. He was also involved in sports medicine, having an affiliation with the Montreal Alouettes and the McGill University football teams and the Montreal Canadiens hockey team.

A man of profound integrity, his long and distinguished career was marked by his caring and selfless dedication to his profession, his patients, and his students.



Dr. Maurice Jurkiewicz, became a member of the Canadian Society of Plastic Surgeons in 1986, he graduated Magna Cum Laude D.D.S at the University of Maryland in 1946,

and then served a tour of duty with the Naval Reserves in Normandy. He went on to earn his Medical Doctorate from the Harvard University Medical School in 1952, and from 1952 to 1959 he completed his Internship, General and Plastic Surgical residencies at Barnes Hospital at Washington University in St. Louis, MO. Dr. Jurkiewicz was certified by the American Board of Surgery in 1960 and 1963. Dr. Jurkiewicz became the Chief of Reconstructive/Plastic Surgery at Emory University in 1971 and held that position until 1993. During those years, in those two programs, some 100 Residents and Fellows were educated by him. Their subsequent many and varied contributions to Surgery and Plastic Surgery are a part of his legacy. Since 1993, he has held the title of Professor of Surgery Emeritus at Emory University. Although retired, he continued to play an active role in the education process of medical students, interns and associates until his death.
