Position Profile: A Full-time Locum Tenens appointment. The successful candidate would become a member of the Roth|McFarlane Hand & Upper Limb Centre which is Canada's largest upper extremity program comprised of a collegial, multi-disciplinary team of eleven Orthopedic and Plastic Surgeons, three research laboratories and an expert team of Hand Therapists. The Division of Plastic Surgery is affiliated with London Health Sciences Centre and St. Joseph's Health Care London and is presently comprised of twelve surgeons with busy clinical practices. The Division has a strong clinical research interest and is an accredited Royal College training program.

Academic and Clinical Expectations: The successful candidate must have a strong interest and advanced training and/or experience in Hand Surgery & <u>advanced microsurgical reconstruction of the upper extremity</u>. This would include reconstruction of complex injuries such as thumb and soft tissue loss.

It is expected that the successful candidate will become a full-time member of the group once a position receives hospital and university approval. They will be expected to participate actively in the Division's academic, research and education initiative including teaching and supervision of undergraduate students, postgraduate trainees and fellows.

Qualifications: The successful candidate must have an MD or equivalent, have completed an accredited Plastic Surgery training program, have advanced training in Hand & Reconstructive Microsurgery, have a strong research interest and/or an advanced degree, and be eligible for licensure in the Province of Ontario.

Compensation Details: Compensation for this position will be commensurate with qualifications and experience and will be primarily composed of the following sources: Fee for service (OHIP billings) and an academic salary. A hospital on-call stipend will be shared equally with all group members on the call schedule.

The City: London, Ontario. London is the fastest growing city in Ontario and Canada's 10th largest city with a population of 400,000, a catchment area of 2 million, and is situated in southwestern Ontario between Toronto and Detroit. The region has a diverse economy and excellent educational opportunities.
