

Assistant or Associate Professor - Plastic & Reconstructive Surgery

The Division of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery in the Sprott Department of Surgery at the University Health Network and the University of Toronto is inviting applications for the position of a full-time Academic Plastic and Reconstructive Surgeon specializing in oncological reconstructive surgery. The successful candidate will join a team of plastic and reconstructive surgeons with a major focus on oncological reconstructive surgery. The successful candidate must have completed specialised fellowship training in oncological reconstruction. Solid expertise in reconstructive microsurgery is required for this position.

The effective date of this appointment is **July 1, 2024**, but can be flexible depending on the candidate.

The candidate's application should demonstrate excellence in research and teaching. Fulltime commitment to academic activity is required. The successful candidate should have a strong research track record, preferably resulting in a M.Sc. or PhD degree. The candidate will be expected to establish a research program in either clinical research or basic science. The successful candidate will also participate in medical student, resident, and plastic surgery fellow education at the University of Toronto. The successful candidate will be seeking an academic role of Surgeon Investigator or Surgeon Scientist.

The candidate must be eligible for appointment at the University of Toronto at the academic rank of Assistant or Associate Professor. The candidate must hold a MD and FRCSC (or equivalent specialist designation) qualification in plastic surgery and be eligible for certification with the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, and licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.

The University Health Network is comprised of the Toronto General Hospital, Toronto Western Hospital, Princess Margaret Cancer Centre, the Toronto Rehabilitation Institute and the Michener Institute of Education, and is Canada's largest and leading clinical and research hospital. The University Health Network is an academic institution affiliated with the University of Toronto and is recognized internationally for excellence in patient care, innovation, research and education. The Plastic Surgery Program at Toronto General Hospital is comprised of four full-time clinical faculty.

Salary is estimated to be between \$400,000 - \$500,000 (CND). This estimate is based on fee for service billings. Additional compensation may be provided commensurate with qualifications and experience.
