DR. PETER NELIGAN started his academic career in Dublin Ireland where he completed his undergraduate and medical school degrees at Trinity College. He completed general surgery then plastic surgery training at Dublin in 1983. Shortly after, he moved to Toronto where he was both a clinical and research fellow at UofT for three years. He completed

fellowships in burns, microvascular surgery, and pediatric plastic surgery. Many CSPS alumni will remember these early days fondly, as Peter does. Following this, he then pursued private practice in Sudbury ON. He made many good friends and gave his patients "Stacked in Sudbury" t-shirts.

Dr. Margaret Wheelock nominated Dr. O'Brien for this award, writing: "Throughout our various interactions, Jim has always been a supportive mentor to me, oering guidance and advice as my roles changed. Throughout these, his true enjoyment of plastic surgery and genuine interest in the mentee has been paramount."

## **CSPS 2025 Lifetime Achievement Award**

Purpose

This award honors an established plastic surgeon who is a member of the Canadian Society of Plastic Surgeons and has made an outstanding contribution to the profession and to the CSPS.

The award will be made on the basis of teaching, research, innovation and service to the community or other endeavors.

Nominees for this annual award will be reviewed by the CSPS Nominating Committee.

Eligibility

Members in good standing of the CSPS for at least 20 years are eligible.

The Award

The Award consists of the waiver of registration fees for the Annual Meeting in the year in which the award is bestowed and a plaque given at the annual President's Banquet.

#### Nomination Procedure

The complete nomination consists of a letter from a member of the CSPS formally proposing the nominee and outlining the nominee's specific contributions to plastic surgery and to the Society accompanied by the nominee's curriculum vitae.

However, his calling was in academics, and in 1991 UofT was lucky to recruit him back to join faculty. Five years later, he became Chair in the UofT Division of Plastic Surgery, and he served in this role for ten years. His productivity was of epic proportions, and it was clear that he was a pioneer, innovator, and an amazing teacher. His students, residents, and colleagues benefitted greatly from his uncanny ability to problem solve, his lack of fear to take on the biggest/hardest challenges, and his desire to push our specialty forward. His CV has seven pages of trainees who have benefitted from his expertise, including his most cherished - Dr. Joan Lipa and Dr. Richard Hopper. At UofT, he was double-appointed in Plastic Surgery and Otolaryngology, and had a keen interest in head and neck reconstruction. He was, and still is a wellestablished expert in this domain.

In 2007 Dr. Nick Vedder recruited him to the University of Washington in Seattle WA to take on the role of section chair for Plastic Surgery (reconstruction group) at the UW Medical Center. He was tasked with growing a program of reconstructive microsurgeons, which when he joined was a group of two young graduates (Drs Hakim Said and David Mathes). He got to work quickly and over the next 12 years he doubled the group's size and started a microsurgical fellowship program. During his time at UW he shifted his practice to focus on his new passion – lymphatic surgery. He pioneered this field, and pushed it forward at a remarkable pace. He attended meetings, worked with expert groups, tried innumerable instruments/microscopes, and developed a full lymphatic program at UW, including having it designated as a "Center of Excellence" in lymphatic surgery. He also published a textbook on the topic and continues to provide expertise/invited lectures into his retirement.

Peter's gift as a leader was his lack of ego. Honestly, I'm not sure that those he worked with truly understood how much of a "big deal" he was internationally in our surgical community. He was just as likely to stay late, work overnight, do call, or help out a colleague no matter if it was in the middle of the night or if he was ravelling overseas. And in reciprocation, we often covered his patients when he spent half the year traveling to various meetings and invited lectures.

Perhaps what our residents will best know him for is "THE BOOK" – his editorial

fellowships—1 at The University of Western Ontario and another at Southern Illinois University where he maintained strong ties with his mentors Dr. Bob Russel and Dr. Elvin Zook—both leaders and masters in hand surgery.

Dr. Murray moved to Winnipeg in 1982 working at Misericordia Hospital and St. Boniface Hospital alongside Dr. GB Singh and Dr. Reid Waters with whom they established Plastic Surgery Associates of Winnipeg and one of the first private day surgery facilities in Canada - The Western Surgery Centre over 40 years ago. At the time of his arrival, he entrenched himself in the academic residency program. Dr. Murray became Residency Program Director in 1996 and held this position for over a decade until 2007! He was also an Associate Professor at The University of Manitoba and held the position of University Section Head in Plastic Surgery from 1999-2003.

His contributions were not only tremendous at The University of Manitoba but also to Canadian Plastic Surgery as a whole. He was Chief Examiner for Plastic Surgery at the Royal College from 1993-1995 and examiner at the American Board of Plastic Surgery until recently. He has held executive committee memberships in every major international hand surgery society, and has held almost every major Canadian Presidency in Plastic Surgery including President of GAM for 3 years between 1989-1991, Manus President in 1992-1994, and Presidency of CSPS Education Foundation 1993-1995. This all culminated in being CSPS President in 2005. His dedication to advancing and representing Canadian Plastic Surgery at the national and international stage has been exceptional to say the least.

Despite all of these accomplishments his true passion has always been teaching future generations of plastic surgeons who have come through Winnipeg. Many of his

#### In memoriam - Lawrence Hurst, MD. **FRCSC**



The Canadian Society of Plastic Surgeons regrets the passing of Dr. Lawrence N. Hurst on October 24, 2023

Dr. Hurst graduated from the University of Toronto in 1965. He post-graduate did

training in plastic surgery at the University of Toronto from 1966 to 1971 and was granted his fellowship in surgery in 1971. In 1972, he did a fellowship year at Stanford University Medical Centre in California and is American Board Certified in Plastic Surgery. He joined the University of Western Ontario faculty in 1973 and held the rank of Chairman, Division of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery. His clinical and research interests were in plastic, hand and micro surgery. He has published widely in these areas. He was Program Director, Residency Training Program of Plastic and Reconstructive Surgery from 1992 to 1997 at the University of Western Ontario and he currently holds the rank of Professor Emeritus.

He was awarded the CSPS Lifetime Achievement Award in 2013 at which time his colleague, Dr. Brian Evans said: "In his professional life he provided mentorship for many of the members of the society, and gave many others a few gray hairs when he served as an examiner for the College. I still see patients in my office who worship him for what he has done for them."

Dr. Hurst became a CSPS member in 1972. He held the office of President of the CSPS Educational Foundation from 1987 to 1989, Vice-President of the CSPS from 1990-91 and President from 1991-92. He was chair of the Royal College Plastic Surgery Specialty Committee from 1996-1999.

### **FRCSC**



The Canadian Society of Plastic Surgeons regrets the passing of Dr. Gordon Knutson. MD. FRCSC on May 9, 2023.

Born in Regina the year of the Great Depression, Gordon's future might at first have seemed

uncertain to his Norwe-gian and Swedish immigrant parents — but what proceeded was a charmed life.

He excelled at three professions: hockey player, dentist, and plastic surgeon, and was happily married to his high school sweetheart for 70 years, raising four children.

Hockey was good to "the Blond Blizzard." He won the league scoring title while playing for the Regina Pats. He was the star centre of the Montreal Royals when they became the first team from Quebec to win the Memorial Cup. And at 19, he facedoff against Jean Beliveau in the Quebec Senior Men's League all-star game. Gordie Howe once told a family friend that "Gordie Knutson was the best prospect ever turned out of Saskatchewan."

He surprised the Montreal Canadiens when he refused their offer of a two-way pro contract. By then, he'd moved onto his next goal: dentistry. He practiced in Calgary, and then moved to England with his bride, Marjorie Brown. There he supported himself playing in the British Hockey league while studying oral surgery in London. He was the first Canadian to be awarded a Fellowship by the Royal College of Surgeons.

With a new interest in surgery, Gordon decided to pursue medicine at McGill. He was a resident at the Montreal General Hospital, followed by residency at four Toronto teaching hospitals. Further studies took him to Chicago, training under hand surgery pioneer, Dr. Koch; to Buffalo, for head and neck surgery at Roswell Park; and to the world-renowned Burn Unit in East Grinstead, England. He became a member of the Canadian Society of Plastic Surgeons in 1967.

#### In memoriam - Gordon Knutson MD, In memoriam - Stuart Heddle MD, FRCSC



The Canadian Society of Plastic Surgeons regrets the passing of Dr. Stewart Heddle November 5, 2023.

Trained as a plastic surgeon at Columbia Presbyterian in New York and returning home to Hamilton, he practiced in the

Hamilton community for 36 years. A CSPS member since 1977, Dr. Heddle was one of the early microsurgeons in the community initially at the Hamilton Civic Hospital before the amalgamation of the hospitals. He had many leadership roles including the Burn Unit Director. He had broad interests clinically from Burns and Trauma, to vasectomy reversals and aesthetic surgery. He was one of the few members of our community to have his own surgical facility where he practiced after leaving the Hamilton General.
