The successful candidate should be eligible for an academic appointment in the Faculty of Medicine, Department of Surgery at the University of Ottawa and will receive an academic rank commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Applicants are required to have at least one year Fellowship training in Pediatric Plastic Surgery, should hold or be eligible to be a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and be eligible for medical licensure in the Province of Ontario. Applicants should have a proven record of excellence in clinical care and teaching.

It is desired that applicants exhibit a skill set, which will augment the service delivery of the current Division and demonstrate a commitment to clinical research. Resources include access to clinic space with well-appointed minor surgery facility, and main operating room time either at CHEO or in other community hospitals. Functionality in French is an asset but not a requirement.
