



Staff Paediatric Plastic Surgeon, Department of Surgery, Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario

Full Time Academic Position

The Children's Hospital of Eastern Ontario (CHEO) invites applications for the position of Full-Time Staff Plastic Surgeon, Division of Paediatric Plastic Surgery in the Department of Surgery.

The successful candidate will join the existing complement of three full-time Paediatric Plastic Surgeons and provide a diverse clinical-academic practice including general paediatric plastic surgery. It will be required to cover 1:4 full-time paediatric plastic surgery call. The role includes active engagement in clinical teaching and research at the University of Ottawa. A full-time appointment in the Faculty of Medicine, Department of Surgery at the University of Ottawa will be provided, with an academic rank commensurate with qualifications and experience.

Applicants are required to have Fellowship training in Paediatric Plastic Surgery, should hold Certification in Plastic Surgery from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and be eligible for medical licensure in the province of Ontario. Applicants should have a proven record of excellence in clinical care and academic involvement.

It is desired that applicants exhibit a skill set which will augment the service delivery and advance the academic vision of the Division of Plastic Surgery and also of the Department of Surgery. Resources include access to clinic space with well-appointed minor procedure rooms, and main operating room time both at CHEO and in regional community hospitals. Functionality in French and a Master's degree is an asset, but not a requirement.

CHEO is located in Ottawa, Canada's National Capital and one of its most beautiful cities. The greater Ottawa area is home to 1.25 million people and provides a thriving, multicultural and bilingual environment rich with history and cultural activities, in addition to an abundance of accessible sporting and natural resources.
