The Division of Plastic Surgery at St. Michael's Hospital, Unity Health Toronto is inviting applications for a Clinical Associate. The anticipated start date of this appointment is January 4, 2021.

The responsibilities of this position include general Plastic Surgery clinical practice and on call duties. An interest in hand and upper extremity surgery would be an asset. This is a 6-month contract with potential for renewal. Compensation is through fee for service with OHIP billings and on-call stipend. Resources would include a minimum of 2 operating room days per month, one half day clinic per week, as well as access to a minor procedure room. On call responsibilities would be 1 in 4.

St. Michael's Hospital is a downtown teaching and research hospital, affiliated with the Department of Surgery at the University of Toronto. We are a Level 1 Trauma Centre and Plastic Surgery is intimately involved in the care of soft tissue injuries, maxillofacial trauma, and hand injuries. There is a breadth of the type and complexity of the cases we see at the hospital and we serve as a provincial tertiary referral center for reconstructive surgery. There are currently three Plastic Surgeons within the Division.

The candidate will be expected to possess exemplary clinical skills and professionalism, with evidence of excellent interpersonal and collaboration skills. The candidate will be required to support the division of plastic surgery with occasional teaching commitments and involvement with the plastic surgery trainees.

The successful candidate will be certified by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and hold licensure with the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario.
