Responsibilities include the care of inpatients/outpatients and education of undergraduate and postgraduate trainees. The position would include a clinical appointment at the appropriate rank through the College of Medicine in Saskatchewan. The program is in the process of developing an accredited Royal College Training Program. . There is opportunity to practice a full spectrum of plastic and reconstructive surgery. The successful candidates will have appointments in both Saskatchewan Health Authority and the University of Saskatchewan.
