Fraser Health Authority is seeking two general community plastic surgeons. Ideal candidates will possess a passion for community plastic surgery and its diverse scope, with no fellowship requirement for application. We seek applicants with a keen interest in general community plastic surgery, encompassing trauma, hand, breast, and skin cancer management. Microsurgery enthusiasts can explore opportunities within our Fraser West group. The successful applicants will play a pivotal role in establishing a plastic surgery presence at Abbotsford Regional Hospital and Cancer Centre (ARHCC).

As a level 3 Trauma Centre, ARHCC delivers advanced care to its surrounding communities, including Pediatrics, Critical Care, and Surgery. The center offers comprehensive plastic surgery resources, such as scheduled OR time, urgent/emergent OR access, and ambulatory care/cast clinic facilities. Notably, ARHCC hosts a bustling Breast Health Care Clinic, delivering evidence-based care for breast cancers and reconstruction. Additionally, opportunities exist for MSP cases in private facilities and potentially other hospital centers in Fraser Valley East.

ARHCC ensures dedicated weekly daytime trauma slots, safeguarding ideal candidates from nightly on-call duties. Presently, general plastic surgery call stands at 1 in 5, with an accompanying MOCAP agreement providing an on-call stipend. This call responsibility is regional, shared with plastic surgeons at Langley Memorial Hospital, and soon, Ridge Meadows Hospital (once staffing is complete, call will shift to 1 in 6). This coverage extends across Fraser Valley East, encompassing ARHCC, Langley Memorial Hospital, Mission Memorial Hospital, Chilliwack General Hospital, Fraser Canyon Hospital, and Ridge Meadows Hospital upon the addition of a surgeon. The group maintains affiliations with the University of British Columbia, offering teaching prospects for medical students and residents, although ARHCC is not a primary residency-training site. Furthermore, numerous private clinics in the area provide additional resources.
